

## Stevens County Commissioners Journal Book B

Book B covers from 1887 to 1893.

In October 1879, Spokane County was re-created. Stevens County then consisted of the current north half of Chelan, Ferry, Okanogan, Pend Oreille, and Stevens counties. The courthouse moved from former Pinkney City to the current town of Colville.

In February 1888, Okanogan County was created. Stevens County then consisted of the current counties of Ferry, Pend Oreille, and Stevens County.

Extractor's note July 4, 2021

This extraction is not an exact extraction. My intent is a searchable document to find individuals, places, and events. It is best to check the actual image.

- Abbreviated words are typed out.
- I used the correct spellings of words and many names of known Stevens County officials. An example: Francois Hubert is written Ubear, Yubear and other spellings, but I used Hubert.
- Names and place: I used the current spellings of names and places. Examples: Pend Oreille is spelled many different ways and I try to use the current spelling
- [?] means I couldn't not determine what was written.
- [word or words] means I don't believe what I typed is really what the writer intended but it was the best I could come up with.
- Items with {} markings are my notes based on my research.

The bound Stevens County Surveyors Road Books are photographed to 1923 at this time and JPG versions are available from Stevens County Public Works or the Stevens County Historical Society. Road surveys start in 1884 but they appear to have been copied from earlier records at some point in 1895 or after and do not include Okanogan or Ferry County Roads.

School District notes are for Stevens County. They are based on research in Stevens County Deeds and *The Last Bell* by Alpha Naff. For other counties, contact that county's historical society.

Post Office information is from the U.S., Appointments of U. S. Postmasters, 1832-1971 viewed on Ancestry, and from the National Archives and Records Administration Post Office Locations RG 28.

School has been held in nine districts during the quarter and before the end of the present month school will be opened in most of the 20 district of our county an chief difficulty at present in starting school is the scarcity of certificated teachers, however a semi-annual examination will take place on the 13<sup>th</sup> of this month, and then I hope to be able to furnish all the districts with teachers. We cannot really have our school matters in proper shape unless we do as is done in other counties, in grade of teachers must necessarily by law. The law provides for Teachers Institutes as a means for instructing teachers in the work of the school room. We have not such an organization in our county although the law provides in Section 79 that we shall have one. Therefore, gentlemen, I request you as parties interested in education to grant an appropriation of \$100.00 to defray the necessary expenses of such an institute. It will be the means of advancing the interests of education. It will advance the grade of our teachers and at the same time give them the necessary instructions to make a success of their school work. It is the unanimous desire of those interested in education in our county that you make the necessary appropriation to establish the Teachers Institute according to Section 79 of the present school law. You are also requested to authorize my action in forming a new school district at Springdale to be known as District 20, you are also requested gentlemen to furnish me with at least 24 copies of School Laws as the people of the county need them, 1<sup>st</sup> because the newcomers do not know the laws of our state and 2<sup>nd</sup> because they might to have them to help them in the new districts. It is ordered that a Road District to be known as Road District No. 19 be created with boundaries as follows: Beginning at Lake Creek to Moor's and running down Columbia River to opposite 40 Mile Stake on Columbia River thence East following the divide between Harvey & Hunters Creeks to the summit of Huckleberry Mountain and from thence north to head waters of Lake Creek thence down said creek to place of beginning S. F. Shaffer appointed supervisor of said district.

It is ordered that a Road District to be known as road district No. 20 with boundaries as follows be created commencing at the 40 Mile Stake on Columbia River and running thence down the Columbia River to a rocky bluff opposite Rogers Bar thence east along the south side of Fred Wendt farm following said east corner to the divide and following the divide between Pleasant Valley and Spring Valley to Huckleberry Mountains thence in a north course to the line of District 19 thence along said line in a west course to the place of beginning. Frank Ferguson was appointed supervisor of said district. Petition for road laid over from February Session was taken up and read as follows: commencing from the Chewelah and Colville Road near the school house in District No. 11 located on Section 23 Towns 33 Range 39 E Stevens County Washington running west on  $\frac{1}{4}$  section one mile thence angle a southwesterly direction on the most practicable route intersecting the Locke Road at or near McLean's ranch. The board being satisfied that said road would be of public benefit and the requirement of the law being satisfied with, it is hereby ordered that said road be viewed and surveyed and that Magnus Flett and R. Rickers be appointed viewers and with J. M. Bewley surveyor meet at the school house on the 18<sup>th</sup> May 1890 view and survey the same and make report of their action in the matter on or before the next regular session of this board. three hundred nor more than fifteen hundred viz: three hundred and ten inhabitants ascertained by actual census taken this day.

That a notice of intention to incorporate together with the said petition praying for said incorporation was published in a weekly newspaper to wit. A Resolution authorizing an indebtedness of sixty-five thousand dollars (\$65,000) and providing for the issuance, sale, and redemption of negotiable bonds in that sum for the purpose of paying the current expenses of the County of Stevens and providing for a special election that the voters of said county may vote for or against the said proposition.

Whereas, to the need that the interest upon the indebtedness of the county may be reduced and the expenses of the county lessened, it is advisable and for the interest of said county that it shall issue its negotiable bonds for the sum of sixty-five thousand dollars.

And, whereas, the proposed indebtedness of sixty-five thousand dollars together with the present indebtedness of said Stevens County would exceed one and one-half per centum of the taxable property of said county as ascertained by the last assessment for state and county purposes on to-wit the first day of April 1892, but that said proposed indebtedness together with the present indebtedness of said county would not exceed five (5) per centum of its taxable property as ascertained by said assessment of April 1<sup>st</sup>, 1892.

Therefore, be it resolved, by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Stevens:

That, on the sixth day of July 1893, in the County of Steven and State of Washington, pursuant to the provisions of an act of the legislature of the State of Washington, entitled "An act authorizing and empowering the organized counties of the State of Washington to contract indebtedness to

issue bonds for fund the same and declaring an emergency” approved on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of March 189, there will be held a special election in order that the voters of said county may at said election vote for or against the proposition authorizing the County of Stevens to become indebted in the sum of sixty-five thousand dollars and to issue negotiable bonds therefor for the purpose of paying the current expenses of said Stevens County and for no other purpose.
