This extraction is not an exact extraction. My intent is a searchable document to find individuals, places, and events. It is best to check the actual image.

- Abbreviated words are spelled out.
- I used the correct spellings of words and many names of known Stevens County officials. An example: Francois Hubert is written Ubear, Yubear and other spellings, but I used Hubert.
- Names and place: I used the current spellings of names and places. Examples: Pend Oreille is spelled many different ways and I try to use the current spelling
- [?] means I couldn't not determine what was written.
- [word or words] means I don't believe what I typed is really what the writer intended but it was the best I could come up with.
- Items with {} markings are my notes based on my research.

The bound Stevens County Surveyors Road Books are photographed to 1924 at this time and JPG versions are available from Stevens County Public Works or the Stevens County Historical Society. Road surveys start in 1884 but they appear to have been copied from earlier records by S. F. Sherwood page 118 & 119 this ledger before December 5, 1905 and do not include Okanogan or Ferry County Roads.

School District notes are for Stevens County. They are based on research in Stevens County Deeds and *The Last Bell* by Alpha Naff. For other counties, contact that county's historical society.

Post Office information is from the U.S., Appointments of U. S. Postmasters, 1832-1971 viewed on Ancestry, and from the National Archives and Records Administration Post Office Locations RG 28.

Do check back for an updated version of this document as I find errors along the way.

A great many applications having been made by citizens from various parts of Stevens County for their personal property exemption for 1904 taxes, the Board of Commissioners after having referred the matter to the Attorney general are obliged to refuse to allow exemptions at this time; in accordance with the opinion of the Attorney General. Board of County Commissioners, Colville, Washington

Gentlemen: Your letter of the 7<sup>th</sup> instant has been received wherein you ask whether the board should refund taxes on \$300, which under the law, but which by mistake or inadvertence was not claimed by a taxpayer at the time of submitting his statement to the Assessor and which was not claimed before the Board of Equalization. The Attorney General is of the opinion that where no claim is made for the exemption before the County Assessor, and no application made to the Board of Equalization, that there is no mode in which a refund can be made. By failing to make claim to the Assessor and before the Board of Equalization the exemption is waived.

That whenever it shall be necessary to excavate or in any manner interfere with said public highway, the said grantees shall complete the work as soon as possible, and without delay restore such highway to as good condition as before it was

interfered with, and during the progress of such work they shall at all times leave wholly unobstructed and securely guarded a portion of said public highways sufficient to accommodate continuously, all travel and traffic.

The following opinion of the County Prosecuting Attorney was received from the county attorney and place on file.

Colville, Washington, May 11, 1906

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Stevens County,  
Washington,

Gentlemen,

I have your favor of this instant, asking the opinion of this office as to whether or not E. O. Snodgrass, whom you some time ago appointed Game Warden of this county, is a county officer, and if you have the right to allow him as such Game Warden appointed as aforesaid, a lump sum in addition to his salary, for his expenses, or whether or not he must present a bill to you accompanied by his affidavit and vouchers, as other county officers are required to do, and in reply thereto permit me to state, that Section 2, Chapter 172 of the Laws of 1905, gives you the power to appoint what is called in said section a game warden of such county. Said section further provides that you may allow him a salary of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 per month for his services as such game warden. Said section uses the language "game warden of such county." Section 3 of the same chapter starts out with the following words: "All county game wardens shall be ex-officio state game wardens, etc.", having reference, of course, as you will readily see to the "game warden of such county", referred to in Section 2 of the same chapter. You will therefore see, and it is clearly my opinion that Mr. Snodgrass is, by virtue of such appointment, a county officer, and that it would not be right or

proper for you as a Board of County Commissioners to allow him a fixed salary and in addition thereto allow him a lump sum for his expenses. Section 2 hereinbefore referred to, makes no provision for the game warden appointed by you receiving anything for expenses, but simply fixes what you may fix as the maximum and the minimum of the salary that you have a right as a Board of County Commissioners to allow him; but it is, however my opinion that the necessary and reasonable expenses that may be from time to time incurred by such game warden in the necessary and reasonable discharge of his duties if a bill is duly and regularly presented to you by such game warden, accompanied by vouchers and an affidavit, you would have the right as a Board of County Commissioners to allow.

Snodgrass was duly appointed by the Board of Commissioners of Stevens County, as Game Warden of said county, and his salary fixed of record at \$25.00 per month on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of April 1906, for the performance of the duties of said office, with the understanding with the said E. O. Snodgrass that his necessary expense of travel in the performance of the duties of said office would be defrayed by said county; and

Whereas, during the month of March said E. O. Snodgrass did travel over large portions of said county in the necessary performance of the duties of said office a great expense to himself, and was entitled, in view of the said understanding, to be reimbursed by said county for such expenses in the sum of \$75.00 and, whereas, on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of April 1906, in pursuance of said understanding and agreement, the Board of County Commissioners of said county, did make an allowance to the said E. O. Snodgrass by order of said board in regular session, of the sum of \$75.00, and no warrant has yet been issued for said sum, or for any sum to the said E. O. Snodgrass, and whereas, doubts have arisen as to the authority of the Board of County Commissioners to allow expenses in addition to the salary of said E. O. Snodgrass, and whereas, it was the intention of the said board at the time of the fixing of said salary, that the expenses of the said E. O. Snodgrass should be borne by said county, and whereas, the said Board of County Commissioners are now advised that the salary of said E. O. Snodgrass

should have covered the whole amount intended to be paid to him by said county for expenses, it is therefore, now hereby ordered, that the former order of this board made on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of April 1906, be amended to read as follows:

That the salary of the said game warden be and the same is hereby fixed at \$100 per month, from said date, to-wit, March 7, 1906, date of his appointment, as such game warden, and same is hereby ordered paid out of the game fund.
