

Plat of


ORCHARD HILL ADD'N

Description.

This Plat embraces the following described piece of land in King County, State of Washington, to wit:-

Beginning at a point in the West line of Government Lot 8, Sec. 5 of Township 24 North of Range 4 East of Willamette Meridian; thence No° 10' 45" E along the West line of said Lot 8 573.47 ft. to the North line of Charles Street; thence along said N. line of Charles Street, 588° 42' 05" E 19.08 ff to East line of Sturgus Road; thence along said East line of Sturgus Road 540° 49' 10" E, 357.38 ft. to North line of Dean Street; thence following said North line way of the Seattle & Rainier Beach Railway; thence following said right of way 527° 29' 20" E 142.62 ft. to E line of 16th Ave. So.; thence along said E line of 16th Ave. So. 50° 04' 40" E, 692.71 ft. thence 109° 49' 20" W, 141.01 ff; thence 50° 30' 40" W, 136.00 ff, thence N 89° 49' 20" W 16.00 ff. Thence 50° 30' 40" W 125.41 ff to the S.E. corner of said Lot 8; thence N 89° 57' 45" W, 198.61 ff to the S.W. corner of Lot 8; thence N 0° 10' 45" E, 7.36 ff. to point of beginning. All of said land being in said Lot 8 Sec. 5, and the NW quarter of Section 4, T 24 N R 4 E. W.M.

The initial point is the S.W. cor. of Block 1, being a point on the W. line of said Lot 8, and 1332.05 ft. North of the South line of Sec. 5 measured along the W. line of Government Lots 8 and 9; said point being also the S.E. corner of Block 4 of McAleer's Supplement to Seattle Homestead Addition. All bearings refer to the City Meridian. Stone monuments have been set at points as shown on plat. Charles and Norman Sts. and 16th Ave. So. as here shown conform to the corresponding streets in the adjoining additions.


Dedication.
